GAME PREVIEW

Oregon, USC to battle it out under the Autzen lights

Too bad USC and Oregon didn't play each other last week.

Both football teams lost games last weekend that they were favored to win, taking some of the shine off of the Pacific-10 Conference matchup between the schools 8 p.m. Saturday before a capacity crowd at Autzen Stadium. ESPN will also be on hand, televising the event live nationally.

The Ducks, 2-1 overall and 1-0 in the Pac-10, dropped a big egg of a loss at Utah last week, 24-17. The Trojans, 1-2 overall and 0-1 in the conference, fell at home to Arizona State, 32-25, just a week after rolling over Penn State.

Needless to say, both teams' stomachs are growling for a win.

"The players are naturally more excited," Oregon Coach Rich Brooks said.

And maybe a little nervous, too.

The game, to be played before a projected record Autzen crowd, is being broadcast on live national television, and would be a very important win for so early in the season. To the victor, the spoils, and to the loser, well ...

"The Pac-10 is so well balanced that anyone can afford a loss," USC Coach Larry Smith said. "You're not out of it, but when you have a loss, your back is to the wall."

A loss would put a wall on all sides of the Trojans, making USC 1-3 for the first time in 30 years. It does not help the USC cause that Oregon has not lost at home in the last 10 games.

"Playing at Oregon, where they haven't lost in two years, is a real challenge," Smith said.

But the challenge has somewhat evaporated with the possible loss of Oregon's star tailback Sean Burwell. The sophomore's ankle

injury has him listed as "extremely doubtful" by Brooks.

Junior Donovan Moore will likely start in Burwell's place, as he did last week at Utah. Moore rushed 18 times for 76 yards.

"Basically, I'm going to try to redeem myself (against USC)," Moore said.

Also hurting the Oregon offensive game will be a hip injury to starting fullback Juan Shedrick, who may see limited action because of the ailment.

On the defensive side of the ball, Oregon's Jeff Cummins is possibly out for the season with a foot injury, and injuries to starters Marcus Woods and Joe Farwell have them at less than 100 percent.

Starting cornerback Daryle Smith will also not play in the USC game. Smith was suspended indefinitely earlier in the week for unspecified disciplinary reasons.

"We are pretty beat up," Brooks said. "We've got some bumps and

bruises."

And glory be, here comes USC at a very bad time for Oregon. Literally.

Brooks is not in favor of the late 8:08 kickoff, saying the starting time is "stretching it." But he does not think the bright lights and dark sky will hurt the contest.

"I don't think the time of the game will affect the outcome," he said.

What will ultimately affect the outcome of the game is the teams

themselves, and USC, despite losing to Memphis State 24-10 in their home opener, is no patsy.

USC junior Mazio Royster, one of the top tailbacks in the nation, has had an off-season so far because of an injury, but that does not mean Royster is not still dangerous.

As the leading rusher in the Pac-10 a year ago, Royster tore up opposing defenses, but he has never played Oregon. The Ducks and the Trojans last meeting was Oregon's

42-14 loss at the L.A. Coliseum in 1988.

"Mazio Royster is very decisive, swift-running, and a very attacking back," Brooks said. "He really punishes tacklers. He's more inclined to run over them."

Brooks is not as afraid of Royster as he is of the "enormous" offensive line that blocks for USC, he said. The Trojans have one of the top freshman in the nation in 6-foot-7, 275-pound tackle Tony Boselli.

But the question on the Trojan offense is the passing attack. Sophomore quarterback Reggie Perry leads a mostly run-oriented USC offense, and passing hasn't been their specialty this season.

"As I say that, they'll probably pass for 300 yards against us," Brooks said.

The Trojans' defense is the best Oregon will have seen so far this season, Brooks said.

"They have clearly the best speed and athletic ability of any defense we've seen," Brooks said.

Leading the USC defense is sophomore cornerback Jason Oliver, whose three interceptions ties him for the nation's lead.

Game notes: There have been 24 first-team All-American offensive linemen from USC since 1964, and 17 Trojan offensive linemen have been first-round NFL draft picks since 1968 ... Autzen's projected crowd of more than 46,000 fans is expected to break the record 46,087 attendance at the 1989 Civil War game ... Trojan brothers Kian and Kyle Ramsay, both offensive linemen, are natives of Independence, Ore. ... Oregon quarterback Brett Salisbury is the brother of former USC signalcaller Sean Salisbury ... Former USC head coaches John McKay and John Robinson served as assistants at Oregon.
