Amendment, sponsored by U.S. Sen. Connie Mack, D-Fla. and that would prohibit U.S. subsidiaries in foreign countries from trading with Cuba, she said.

In addition, part of the freetrade agreements with Canada and Mexico ironically stipulates those countries must also cease trading with Cuba, Benjamin said. The United States has also attempted to squash other foreign investment efforts in Cuba, Benjamin said.

"In Congress, few are willing to speak out for normalization of relations," having been influenced by the conservative, anti-Castro Cuban American Foundation, Benjamin said.

This same foundation just established an office in Moscow, to lobby the Soviet government against providing further aid to Cuba, Benjamin said. At the same time, the United States "arm-twisted" the Soviet Union into withdrawing its troops from the country.

Inside Cuba, the pressures promote increased complaining, she said. "There's less hope about the future (and) people are starting to question the internal system."

Among those questioning the system, the young — the 60 percent of the population that grew up after the revolution — seem the most critical, Benjamin said. "They're tired of free education and health care. It doesn't mean the same thing to young people."

Benjamin added it was "difficult to gauge how (they) support the system, or whether they support the system. People (still attend) demonstrations but "the spirit isn't the same."

Internal criticism has mounted to the point where Castro has called for a Communist Party congress in October, only the fourth since the revolution.


