### Research center gets new director

The University's Center for the Study of Women in Society has brought Sandra Morgen on board as its new director.

Morgen, formerly an associate professor of women's studies at the University of Massachusetts, will become an associate professor in the University's Department of Sociology.

The center is a nationally recognized, multidisciplinary feminist research organization. It supports research on women and gender by university and community scholars, and sponsors speakers and events concerning women.

Morgen has edited and published two books: Gender and Anthropology: Critical Reviews for Research and Teaching and Women and the Politics of Empowerment. She is presently writing a book about the women's health movement.

Morgen graduated Phi Beta Kappa from the University of Texas at Austin and received master's and doctoral degrees from the University of North Carolina.

## Assistant director for research institute


The Advanced Science and Technology Institute has chosen Cheryl Coate to fill the newly created position of assistant director.
