window. The men were not identified.

Three portable toilets were consumed by an arsonist's fire, near Autzen Stadium, on July 5. No one was arrested.

In addition, minor fires were reported on July 23, 28 and 31; Aug. 25; and Sept. 23.

A possible bomb was reported at Oregon Hall on July 12. An Oregon Hall worker told OPS that the heavy package, bearing no return address, was delivered by a man who did not identify himself.

It was later discovered that the package contained pennies.

Among the OSP reports were several minor assaults and fights.

Records also indicate that individuals were

cited in unrelated incidents for public nudity, indecency and masturbation.

The majority of reports described thefts, including 25 bicycles, more than \$1,600 cash, and a \$4,000 ring, all stolen from various campus locations.

More than a dozen wallets and purses were stolen and at least 26 miscellaneous property thefts occurred.

Among the reports were many found or recovered items: 15 bicycles, seven wallets and purses, and \$100 cash, which was eventually returned to the finder.

Students, faculty and staff are warned not to leave unattended — no matter how briefly — anything that can be picked up, said to Marj Bigelow, a supervisor at OPS.
