

# Leius, Davis homer as Twins power to 2-0 lead

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — The pitch from Tom Glavine was down and in, but Scott Leius sent it up and out of the Metrodome.

Leius' improbable homer leading off the eighth inning barely cleared the left field fence, but it was just enough to give the Twins a 3-2 victory over the Atlanta Braves Sunday night and a 2-0 lead as the

World Series moves south for Game 3 Tuesday night.

The Braves, after playing a sound defensive game in the opener, fell victim to the Metrodome's twin terrors on Glavine's first pitch.

Dan Gladden lifted a high fly to shallow right that second baseman Mark Lemke seemed to lose against the white Teflon roof. Right fielder Justice saw

the ball and rushed in, but apparently Lemke could not hear him calling for it.

At the last instant, Lemke spotted the ball and it hit the pocket of his glove, but was jarred loose when Justice ran into him. Justice was charged with the error for getting in Lemke's way.

Kirby Puckett, who led the majors by grounding into 27

double plays, helped Glavine by bouncing into another one. Davis, however, was not so kind, and having seen Glavine in the National League, reacquainted himself with a 383-foot drive over the left field fence.

The Braves cut their deficit, and the crowd noise, by bouncing back for a run in the second on a leadoff single by Justice, a

quib double by Sid Bream down the third-base line and Hunter's sacrifice fly.

Atlanta tied it at 2-2 in the fifth when Minnesota native Olson doubled to the gap in left-center, moved to third on Lemke's groundout to the right side and scored on a sacrifice fly by No. 9 hitter Rafael Beliard.

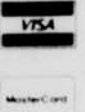
