calls from people with disabilities requesting changes or help from the city.

Her enthusiasm for the work turned what was initially a minor position into a major program with a \$1 million budget.

Wentworth and her mother moved from Los Angeles to Eugene to reduce their stress and to pursue the former's love of gardening.

In her new Onyx Bridge office, Wentworth said she hopes to see a small version of the same success she found in Los Angeles.

Wentworth knows what it's like to have problems. A single, sudden attack of Multiple Sclerosis at age 18 left her unable to walk.

Every day, rain or shine, she rides her motorized wheelchair 10 blocks round trip to and from campus.

Wentworth began work in the University Office of Affirmative Action three years ago. Her primary responsibility there was training groups and individuals to understand equal opportunity, equality in the workplace, sexual harassment and other policy issues.

She still does training, but Wentworth said she likes her

new job because she works mostly one-on-one with people who really need help.

Her present job was created last spring by President Brand. Wentworth answers directly to him.

Wentworth often sees people who are feeling stress because they're distracted from work or study by a troubling relationship with another person on campus. Sometimes it's sexual harassment.

A man Wentworth knew had to drop out of school recently because he was being harassed, she said. Women come to her office with the same problem.

But administrators, instruc-

tors and staff at the University do care about problems experienced by subordinates on campus, Wentworth said. She finds that bad communication is often the problem — and it's not hard to solve.

Wentworth said she doesn't take sides in any altercation. She describes her role as that of a road map: She leads people to solutions — she doesn't solve their problems for them, she said.

In sexual harassment cases, Wentworth advises people to make sure the person doing it is informed that their behavior is unwelcome. If the behavior doesn't stop, the person endur-

ing harassment should file an official complaint through the Office of Affirmative Action, which will launch an investigation, Wentworth said.

Wentworth said she believes the spectacle of Anita Hill being grilled by male senators may leave many women unwilling to participate in such an investigation.

She said the Thomas confirmation could leave women thinking there's too much to lose and little to gain. "Both of those people were crucified in the process of trying to get to the bottom of it, and I don't think they ever did get to the bottom of it," she said.
