Women golfers finish season

The Oregon women's golf team finished its fall season Sunday, tying for 11th out of 18 teams at a rain-shortened Stanford invitational.

The Ducks carded a 638 during the two days at Stanford. San Jose State won the team title with a 606 on the 36 holes, just one stroke ahead of second-place Arizona.

Other Pacific-10 Conference finishers included host Stanford at third with a 612, Arizona State at fifth with a 614, UCLA at sixth with a 621, Washington tied at 11th with a 638, USC at 14th with a 648, and Washington State at 18th with a 716.

Oregon's Shannon Maier and Leigh Hornung tied for 20th in the individual standings with 155 strokes apiece. San Jose State's Tracy Hanson won the individual title with a 143, and Arizona's Annika Sorenstam was second with a 148.

Other Oregon finishers included Beth Manczak at 44th with a 161, Starla Yamada at 66th with a 167, and Karly Mills at 88th with a 178.
