Local bars cater to Halloween partiers

Plans include an elaborate decor scheme of black walls surrounding the dance floor and images of psychotic, perhaps psychedelic "killer clowns" around the room. Patrons will also enter the club through a giant-sized clown face. Cos-

tume judging begins at midnight with cash prizes for the top three guises. The cover charge is \$3.

The Eugene Hilton, 66 E. Sixth Ave., and KUGN will present the 10th annual Halloween party beginning at 9 p.m. This event boasts its favorite band, The Valley Boys, which play Top 40 music. Howl, scream and lipsync contests will be held, as will costume judging for the following categories: best all around disguise, most original, best couple/group, and best Dolly Parton and Clint Black look-alikes. Admission is \$10 at the door.

Local hangout New Max's, 550 E. 13th Ave., presents a costume party with entertainment provided by country/rock band Guardians of American Morality at 10 p.m. The cover charge is \$3.

R&B haven Good Times, 375 E. Seventh Ave., will hold a costume party and feature the sounds of The NightCrawlers at 10 p.m. The cover charge is \$3.
