Director named to post in law school

Eloise Dunn Stuhr has been named director of development for the University law school, University President Myles Brand announced Tuesday.

"As development director for the law school, Stuhr will be responsible for leading the school's fund-raising program, which is expected to have a significant role in the University's upcoming and ambitious capital campaign," Brand said.

Stuhr will also work with the law school dean to oversee the school's advisory boards.

Stuhr, who has been assistant vice president for development and executive director of the University Foundation since 1987, will begin her new position Nov. 4.

Stuhr and her Foundation staff have produced recordbreaking fund-raising totals each year, including \$11.9 million raised during the 1990-91 fiscal year. This year's firstquarter mark is double the amount of money raised in the same period last year.

Bequest to benefit Creative Writing program

Students in the University's Creative Writing program will benefit from a \$1.14 million gift from the estate of Walter Kidd of Portland.

The Walter and Nancy Kidd bequest will establish an endowment to fund a special program of prizes and tutorials in creative writing for undergraduates.

Walter Kidd, a teacher, poet and scholar, was a liberal arts graduate of the University. He received a bachelor's degree in 1926 and a master's in 1935.


"This is a great and historic opportunity to create an excellent, exciting new writing program," said Garrett Hongo, director of the Creative Writing program.
