team in that category to Dawnn Charoin.

Jeffery was also second in hitting percentage and assists and led the team — and the Pacific-10 Conference — in service aces with 61. She is currently number five on the all-time Oregon ace list.

"When she's on in her hitting, she's one of the best," Oregon coach Gerry Gregory said.

But Jeffery didn't begin this season as a starter, and she has collected 63 kills this year — only the fifth-highest total on the team. Despite coming off the bench in this, her last season, Jeffery remains remarkably positive about her team and her

role on it.

"It was a surprise," Jeffery said of not starting at the beginning of the season. "It was really difficult at the start. Part of it is your pride, and part is being a senior and wanting your last year to go well. But I totally respect the coach's position. You have to put the team ahead of yourself."

Gregory said Jeffery's attitude has been excellent.

"She wants the team to do well," Gregory said. "She is a very mature person."

But Stanford coach Dennis Green does not expect too much of a letdown offensively for the Ducks despite the new starter.

"Oregon is going to play a great game," Green said. "We expect Oregon to be looking to go 4-4."

Crowston may have to be the man to get the Ducks back into the win column. O'Neil and Musgrave have been declared lost for the season, and Salisbury is still having trouble even moving his arm because of the shoulder, which suffered tendon and ligament damage.

"God knows when that's going to go away, or even if it's going to go away before the end of the season," Brooks said of Salisbury's injury.

The injuries to the top three have forced Bellotti to take a different approach at moving

the ball against Stanford. Because Crowston's inexperience and the offense's lack of familiarity with him, Bellotti said he will run the ball often because he is not sure of what kind of pass plays will work with Crowston.

"The parts to the passing game have no validity anymore," Bellotti said while thumbing through a stack of sheets listing which plays are most efficient. "We're not playing with Danny O'Neil, Brett Salisbury or Doug Musgrave. We're playing with Kyle Crowston."
