## Rugby team beats veteran squad

Saturday was a reunion of sorts for Oregon rugby coach Bob Snyder, and his team responded with a 13-12 victory over the Oregon Rugby Sports Union.

The win was extra special for Snyder, former president of the rugby union who still has friendships with many of the players. The team consists of men mostly in their thirties who provided a tough warm-up for the Ducks as they prepare for league play.

Oregon led 10-0 early but needed a touch by Brian Zeller midway through the second half to defeat the veteran squad.

The Ducks, fresh off a successful road trip to Humboldt State, scored three minutes into the game when Stewart Matz picked up a loose ball and ran it

25 yards for a try and a 6-0 lead.

Only 10 minutes later, the Ducks stretched their lead to 10-0 on a 15-yard run by Zeller. The rugby union then came back to score 12 straight points in the last 20 minutes of the half to take a 12-10 halftime lead.

Zeller came in and made the touch 15 minutes into the second half to give Oregon the lead again, and the defense did the rest, shutting its opponent out for the entire half.

The Ducks were threatened twice in the early minutes of the game when the rugby union was deep in Oregon territory. Both times the Duck defense, spearheaded by Bob Pierce, turned it away.

"Our forwards were terrific," Snyder said. "We just overpowered them. We should have won by more."

Oregon now starts its Northwest League schedule with a Nov. 16 game at Washington. The Ducks return home Nov. 23 to face Oregon State before the Civil War football game.
