Starting at the other forward position will likely be sophomore Clyde Jordan. Jordan is the only other Duck who got extensive playing time last year when he averaged 3 points and 2.5 rebounds a game

Jordan's biggest asset to the team may be his defensive skills. Last year, Mixon was assigned the task of guarding the opponent's big scorer, and this year, Jordan will most likely fill

Replacing Brandon and Mixon could be the most difficult goal the team will have to accomplish this year. Redshirt freshman Orlando Williams and junior college transfer Andre Collier will likely be back court starters, at least at the beginning of the season.

Williams, who was the Oregon high school player of the year two years ago, practiced with the team all last year and knows the offense. He is a good, pure shooter with good strength for a guard, Monson

Collier is in the unenviable position of following in the footsteps of Brandon, who averaged 26 points a game and was voted Pac-10 Player of the Year last season.

Collier averaged 20 points and eight assists a game last year for DeAnza College in California, and although Monson likes Collier's ability to run an offense, he is realistic about Collier's abilities.

"Collier will not be able to take the place of Brandon, but he will score points for us," Monson said. "He's played in college, so he knows how to

The guard situation could change later on down the road as freshman Johnnie Reece and sophomore Antoine Stoudamire could challenge for playing time.

Reece was last year's player of the year in Colorado where he averaged 35 points, eight assists, seven rebounds and four steals a game during his senior

Stoudamire, a transfer from Georgetown last year, will be eligible to play in mid-December. Stoudamire, who will most likely compete for time at the land's Jesuit High School where he led the state with 24 points and 14 rebounds a game in his

The center position could be the toughest for the Ducks to fill. Starting at the position will be senior Chuck Patterson, who played sparingly last year.

He is the only starter over 6-7, which could be a rebounding problem, especially with Lucas gone.

Monson is impressed with 6-9 freshman Jeff Potter.

'He's an aggressive kid," Monson said.

Also suiting up for the Ducks this year will be sophomore forwards Matt O'Neil and Eric van der Veen, and freshman forwards Kevinn Robinson and Damon Runyon.

This will be an interesting year for the Ducks, and Monson is curious to see what will hap-

"We need time under game conditions," he said. "We have thusiasm. It's hard to tell what these kids will do when they get on Mac Court."
