"What he has done is say 'I support and I am sensitive to the rights of gays and lesbians in this country, but what can I do?'" said graduate teaching fellow Bo Adan.

"Then, when the EMU board finally takes the initiative that he wouldn't take, he vetoes it," he said.

"I think (student) actions are wise, I think their actions are timely, and I think their actions are warranted," he said.

"It's time to tell President Brand that we are taking the higher moral ground."

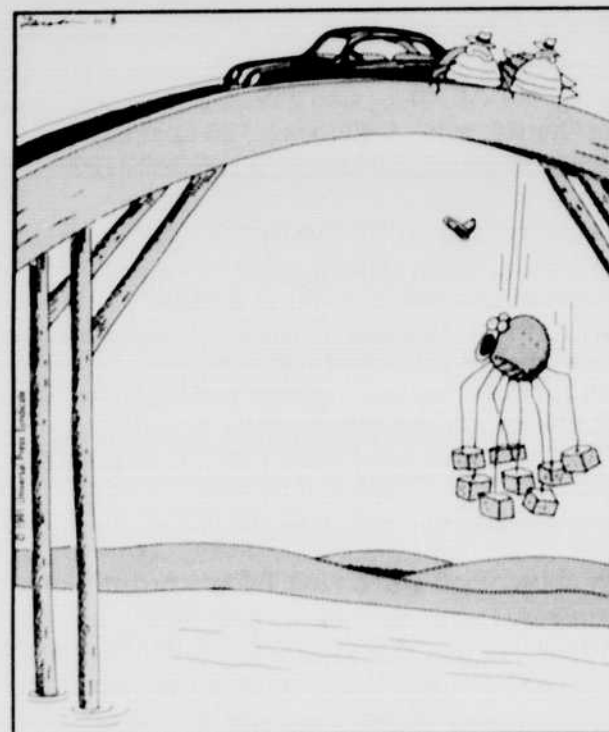
