Ducks may start 5th quarterback

Bob Brothers could become the fifth quarterback to start for Oregon in as many games Saturday at Arizona State.

Seriously. But no one will know for sure who will start until the 6 p.m. kickoff at Tempe's Sun Devil Stadium. Oregon coach Rich Brooks said he would not name a starter until Saturday.

"I'm not going to make that decision until game time," Brooks said. "We're going to work (Kyle) Crowston, Brothers and (Brett) Salisbury and see how it shakes out."

Last week's 33-13 home loss to Stanford dropped Oregon's record to 1-4 in the Pacific-10 Conference and 3-5 overall and shook out Brothers as the top quarterback.

Crowston was ineffective in his first collegiate start against the Cardinal, and Salisbury has been out for the last two games with a shoulder injury. Brothers led the Ducks to their only touchdown last week.

For the most part, the Oregon offense moved the ball nowhere last week and could face even more problems this week with the absence of tailback Sean Burwell. The sophomore has not been running at full speed since sustaining an ankle injury three weeks into the season, and Brooks elected to keep Burwell at home this week.

"Anytime you lose a player of Sean Burwell's calibre, it hurts," Oregon offensive coordinator Mike Bellotti said. "But I don't think the loss of him at this point is that much

of a concern." Burwell, who carried for a career-low 11 yards last week, will be replaced in the starting lineup by Donovan Moore.

Despite the lagging offense, Oregon's defense put in a winning effort last week. Last fall, the Duck defense held Arizona State to 149 yards total offense in the final three periods, and Oregon defensive coordinator Denny Schuler said the Sun Devils, losers of three in a row, 2-3 in the Pac-10 and 4-4 overall, would be looking for revenge.

"What we've done the last two years to them, plus the fact they've lost three in a row, no doubt makes this a major game for them," Schuler said. "You've got two hungry teams here."

Women's volleyball team faces tough Cardinal

After having fallen below the .500 mark for the first time this season, things probably won't get any better tonight for the Oregon volleyball team when it faces top-ranked and undefeated Stanford at 7:30 in McArthur Court.

The Ducks, 12-13 overall and 2-11 in the Pacific-10 Conference, have lost 13 of 16 matches, after setting a school record with a 9-0 start. Coach Gerry Gregory's squad has been decimated by injuries, though, as starters Mindee Adams, Molly McGrath and Marcie Price have missed considerable action this season.

The Cardinal, on the other hand, is in the midst of its best season ever. Stanford has won all 21 matches this season, a school record, and is 12-0 in the Pac-10. Bev Oden, last year's NCAA Player of the Year, leads the team along with fellow All-Americans Kristin
