## Iceland squad gets cold shoulder

It was only an exhibition, and it won't count on the season record, but the Oregon men's basketball team's 87-56 win Thursday night over the Icelandic National Team may bode well for the future.

The Ducks shot their season off like a rocket, scoring the first 14 points of the game. Sophomore guard/forward Clyde Jordan started the scoring with a bang, jamming home an alley-oop pass from junior guard Andre Collier.

Then sophomore forward Jordy Lyden hit a three-pointer, freshman guard Orlando Williams canned a 15-foot jumper, and the Ducks' lone senior, 7-foot center Chuck Patterson, capped off the 14-0 run with a free throw.

Oregon led at the half 41-24 and breezed to the easy win in the second half.

"Generally I was pleased," Oregon coach Don Monson said. "I was especially pleased with the play of the young kids."

Collier and Williams were the most impressive of the newcomers. Collier was solid at point guard and seemed well-suited to the Oregon offense.

He finished with 12 points on 5 of 9 shooting, including two three-pointers on two tries. The 5'10" guard out of DeAnza College in California also dished out three assists and created several other offensive opportunities with aggressive penetration.

"I played all right," said Collier, who didn't practice much this past week while recuperating from the flu. "I didn't play to my full potential."

"Collier ran the ball club well," Monson said. "I don't think there's any question he can run a ball club."

Williams, who redshirted last year, chipped in 10 points, in-

cluding two treys on three attempts. He also handed out seven assists.

Lyden, the Ducks' top returner from last year's 13-15 team, led Oregon with 13 points and was one of seven Ducks in double figures.

All eleven players saw at least nine minutes of action, and all but two scored.

True freshmen Johnnie Reece, Damon Runyon and Jeff Potter all played well for the Ducks. Runyon had 11 points, and Reece and Potter each scored 10.

Runyon has excellent leaping ability and shared top rebounding honors with Matt O'Neil

and Jordan, pulling down six for the game.

Overall, it was a successful start to a campaign that has as many questions to be answered as it does new faces. Only five of the eleven Ducks who played Thursday saw action last year, and only two of those were regulars in the lineup.

"They played hard and they did what we wanted them to do," Monson said. "It always helps to hit the first three or four shots. When you've got young kids you need to get confidence, and I think they got that tonight."

The Icelandic team lost Wednesday night at Washington, 90-66.


