

Volleyball team turns it around

The Oregon volleyball team rode a wave of momentum — and a nearly flawless performance in the second game — to a Pacific-10 Conference win over California Saturday night in front of 803 fans at McArthur Court.

The 6-15, 15-1, 15-13, 15-7 win, only the Ducks' third league victory this season, ensured Oregon would better its worst ever Pac-10 finish of 2-16 in 1988. The Ducks' Pac-10 record now stands at 3-12 and 13-14 overall.

Cal dropped to 7-7 and 10-12 after losing Friday night to Oregon State.

The Ducks started slowly, playing as they had in recent weeks, as California dominated Oregon 15-6 in the first game, including a .238 to .100 advantage in hitting percentage.

But the all-important momentum factor changed quickly in the second game as Oregon played one of its best games of

the season.

With Molly McGrath serving, the Ducks won the first 12 points of the game en route to the 15-1 win. Oregon didn't commit a single error in the game and hit for an amazing .692 percentage. The Golden Bears managed only a .250 percentage, putting down only two kills the entire game.

Cal took leads of 11-7 and 13-9 in the third game, but the Ducks scored the final six points of the match to win the game and take a 2-1 lead in the match.

Oregon dominated the fourth game, winning 15-7 for its only Pac-10 win this season against a team other than Arizona.

"We got some momentum going in the second game," Oregon coach Gerry Gregory said. "We had gotten into some old patterns in the first game, but after that it seemed like every time we missed a serve we'd come back with a strong sideout."

Dawnn Charroin led Oregon with 17 kills on a .412 hitting

percentage and 20 digs, and Mindee Adams, who was unable to play Friday against Stanford, chipped in nine kills and 12 digs. McGrath contributed six kills on a .625 percentage and 20 digs from her setter position to go along with 30 assists.

"I don't like losing," Cal coach Dave DeGroot said, "but I can handle that. What I can't handle is us giving up like that. We just gave up. And Oregon played very well."

The Ducks didn't play nearly so well Friday night, but against top-ranked and undefeated Stanford, it would have taken a herculean effort to get a victory.

Oregon had stretches in which it played evenly with Stanford, but unlike Saturday night's match, the Ducks couldn't sustain momentum.

After losing the first game 15-4, the Ducks closed to 8-4 in the second game before Stanford scored seven of the last eight points to win 15-5.

The Ducks were also up 7-6

in the third game, but last year's NCAA Player of the Year, 6-foot-2 Bev Oden, put down two quick kills and the match ended quickly after that.

"By the way we played I

think you can tell we didn't look past them," Stanford coach Don Shaw said. "One of the reasons for our team's success this year is we don't do that."

Wrestlers dominate season opener

The Oregon wrestling team dominated Portland State 37-2 in the Ducks' first match of the season Friday.

The Ducks lost no matches and tied only once in their win at Portland State. The meeting was the opening match of the season for both teams.

Dan Vidlak was one of two Duck wrestlers to win by a technical fall, downing Chris Gardner in the 118-pound class. Vidlak won 19-3 in 2:20.

Oregon's Solomon Fulp topped James Beardemphl in the 167-pound class for the Ducks' only other technical fall.

Fulp won 22-6 in 6:38.

Other Duck winners included heavy-weight Chris Anderson edging out Ken Fontes 3-2, 190-pounder Scott Buzzard over Steve Cox 12-0, 158-pounder Darren Gustafson in a 3-1 decision over Joey Herrera, 150-pounder Pat Craig over Shane Lake 5-3, 134-pounder Cory Sonnen over Jason Walden 6-1, and 126-pounder Jarrett Clark over Ariah Fasana 10-4.

Oregon's only tie was an 8-8 lockup between Oregon's Jason Muggy and the Vikings' James Sisson.

bad snap, giving Arizona State the ball on the Oregon 15-yard line.

The Sun Devils scored three plays later on Bret Powers' 15-yard touchdown strike to tie the game before the half.

"The key for the game, I thought, was the nine-yard punt near the end of the first half," Brooks said. "If we get any kind of distance on the punt, we're ahead by a touchdown at halftime."

But with the game tied, Arizona State went up 21-14 on Kelvin Fisher's 27-yard touchdown run, capping a 70-yard

drive to open the half.

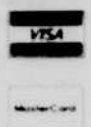
"Once again, Kelvin stepped up for us," Arizona State coach Larry Marmie said. "That was a run we needed badly to get something going and to gain momentum in the second half."

Muhammad Oliver got momentum going for Oregon in the second half, too. Oliver, who attended an Arizona junior college before coming to Oregon, blocked a third-quarter punt and ran it 21 yards for the tying score late in the third quarter.

"Oliver's effort on the blocked punt was one of the best individual athletic efforts I have ever seen," Brooks said.
