IFC cracking down

Student programs with deficits in their stipend accounts will be subject to a 5 percent budget cut next year, according to a unanimous Incidental Fee Committee decision made Thursday.

Groups will have until their scheduled IFC budget hearing dates to clear deficits and avoid penalties. Budget cuts may be overridden by a majority IFC vote and are subject to appeal in cases of special circumstance, according to the resolution.

Budget deficits are most common in stipend and fundraising accounts, said IFC member Sara Dodge who introduced the resolution. In another resolution, the IFC decided it will let students vote on budget allocations that are over \$1 million next year. Two programs that would fall into this category are the EMU and the athletic department, which are traditionally funded at this level with student fees.

Also at Thursday's meeting, the IFC denied a special budget request by the Asian/Pacific American Student Union. APASU requested \$448.32 to cover speaker fees for its fall event, which took place last weekend and included an afternoon with Japanese-American author Lawson Fusao Inada.

APASU co-director Gary Hoh was disappointed with the IFC decision to transfer funds from a later event to cover the fall event. Hoh said APASU is currently at its highest membership in five years and that its program budget is not representative of such membership.

Library news

The Student Senate approved a resolution recommending University President Myles Brand restore library hours to previous levels.

The "Resolution on the Reinstatement of University of Oregon Library Hours" was presented to the Senate Tuesday by Dylan Coulter, founder of Concerned Students for Library The group is especially concerned about the impact of decreased library hours on working students with tight schedules, and on students who depend on the reserve section for required readings.

Library hours have been cut from 102 to 86 hours per week, representing a 16 percent decrease, according to the resolution.
