

# RIM football season ends with small Autzen crowd

The Recreation and Intramurals football championship games, played in front of a less-than-capacity crowd of about 15 in 44,500-seat Autzen Stadium, concluded the season Saturday.

Oxygen tanks on the sidelines would probably have been a good idea along with the decision to use the whole field,

substantially larger than the regulation RIM fields. From the outset, it was obvious the decision would play a big factor in substitutions and play-calling decisions.

Game one of the five-championship games, pitted the team of Sigma Kappa/Sigma Phi Epsilon against the team of Maui 2. This game was a high-scoring affair with five of the seven touchdowns going for 35 yards or more.

Maui 2 jumped on top early, 6-0, but eventually succumbed to the Sigma Kappa/Sigma Phi Epsilon offensive attack and was soundly beaten 32-6.

The second game of championship day had even more offensive fireworks. Alpha Tau Omega and Delta Gamma came away in a squeaker, 51-12, over Chi Psi/Gamma Phi Beta in the Razzle Dazzle Division 1 & 2 championship.

The Men's Division 3 game

was the controversial game of the day. No Play was forced to forfeit when only six eligible players showed up for the game on time.

Derek & The Doorknobs were given the championship but agreed to play an unofficial game with the full amount of people. No Play was the winner of the game, 19-13.

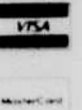
There Was One? won the closest game of the day, 14-6, over Lambda Chi in the Divi-

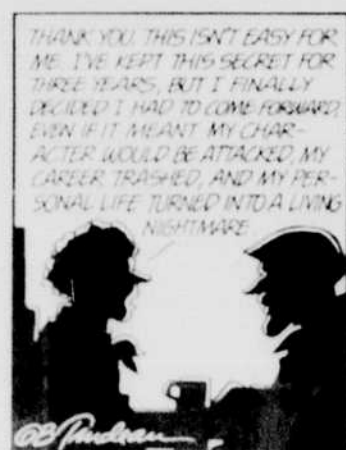
