Ballot Measure #1

Project Saferide is an ASUO program that provides safe transportation on and around campus for all women students. Since Project Saferide was created in 1986, ridership has increased by 1,085%. Since 1989 alone, ridership has quadrupled and Project Saferide budget has only increased 1%. This year Saferide has been denying rides to 5 to 10 women a night for lack of space in the vans. Therefore, shall students pay a one time fee of 35 cents per student per term for one year, providing approximately \$15,286 to purchase a third van for Project Saferide?

Currently, Lane Transit District (LTD) provides bus services for University students with a valid student I.D. for a fee of \$5.09 per student per term for an estimated total of \$261,000 (law students pay 7.64). As part of the current agreement, LTD
