will be investigated jointly by the dean of students and the vice provost.

Dean of Students Jane DeGidio said the reorganization does not change how complaints involving students will be handled. Such cases continue to fall under the Student Conduct Code.

David Hubin, acting executive assistant to the president, said he has seen a mostly positive reaction to the changes over the past few months, adding fears that the decentralization will weaken rather than strengthen affirmative action are un-

"I just don't think there's a chance of some of these issues dropping between chairs, because President Brand is paying too much attention to

ASUO Affirmative Action Coordinator Bobby Lee said the University's affirmative action structure is ineffective - before and after the reorganization.

"We see an inherent conflict of interest," he said. "The affirmative action office within the University will never, never put justice above lia-

Lee is a key supporter of a bill that would help establish an independent affirmative action office, which he is encouraging students to support rather than "jumping on the reorganization band-

Hubin said the affirmative action process will be subject to fine tuning for some time. He said one continuing goal is to make grievance procedures clear to faculty, students and staff.

We want to make sure that no one is bumped out of the process because they are unsure of their rights," Hubin said.
