# Ducks let another one slip away

The thousands of Oregon football fans glumly filing out of Autzen Stadium Saturday afternoon were a fitting symbol for the 1991 season.

Most Duck faithful left early — and with looks of disbelief on their faces — not wanting to see Oregon State put the finishing touches on its only win of the season, a 14-3 dismantling of a listless Oregon team.

The Beavers gave coach Jerry Pettibone his first victory at Oregon State and ended the NCAA's longest Division-I losing streak at 15 games.

The win was only the Beavers' second against Oregon since 1975 and their first at Autzen Stadium since a 17-14 triumph in 1973.

"It was a typical Civil War game from what I understand," Pettibone said. "Low-scoring, physical and hard-fought."

"Oregon State kicked our fannies," Oregon coach Rich Brooks said. "They deserved to win. They outplayed us, and we just did not make plays we needed to make at crucial times."

Saturday's offensive performance was another poor one for Oregon, which managed only 208 yards and three points against an Oregon State defense that had been giving up an average 412 yards and 36 points in its first 10 games.

"We have not produced offensively," Oregon offensive coordinator Mike Bellotti said. "There's been the quarterback situation and injuries and all

that, but we've just lacked people making the big plays."

Oregon's defense played well at times but did allow the Beavers 17 first downs and 278 yards rushing, both Oregon State season highs. The Beavers came in averaging only 162 yards on the ground.

As was the case in last Saturday's 16-7 loss at UCLA, Oregon let good chances to put points on the board slip away.

Probably the most important miscue came late in the third quarter with the Ducks trailing 7-3.

Bob Brothers replaced Brett Salisbury at quarterback in the second half after Salisbury completed just five of 20 passes for 65 yards in the first half, and on the Ducks' second possession of the third quarter, led them on their longest drive of the game.

The drive, which started at the Oregon 17-yard line, ate up almost six minutes before the Ducks had a first-and-ten on the Oregon State 15.

Oregon couldn't gain a yard on three plays and had to settle for a 32-yard field goal try.

That's when disaster struck. The snap to Brothers was high, and Gregg McCallum's kick never had a chance. Oregon State blocked it and recovered the loose ball.

That play — more than any other in a game that for the most part was dominated by Oregon State — seemed to break the Ducks' backs. Oregon never got past its own 30-yard line after the botched field-goal try.

something correct and right, we didn't," Brooks said.

The Oregon defense shut down the Beavers' next possession, but Oregon State put the game away on their first possession of the fourth quarter.

The Beavers started that drive on the Oregon 48, and on a third-and-11 play from the Duck 20, they used a trick play to get their second touchdown.

Quarterback Ian Shields pitched back to sophomore running back Chad Paulson on the option, but Paulson — a sophomore from Mountain View High School in Bend — fooled everyone, including the Oregon defense, by throwing a 20-yard touchdown pass to a wide-open Maurice Wilson.

"Oregon State was more ready to play and they executed better," said Brooks, who lost the Civil War game for just the second time in his 15 years as Oregon's head coach.

Saturday's loss just added salt to the wounds of Oregon's seniors, who after going to two straight bowl games have suffered through a disappointing final season.

"It hasn't hit me yet," nose tackle Marcus Woods said, "but it's going to hit me for the rest of my life. This was my last collegiate game. It was just one of those seasons. What can you say? This is going to be a blemish on my career."

Oregon's season ended at 3-8, their worst mark since a 4-6-1 record in 1983. The Ducks, who lost eight of their last nine games, also finished tied for last in the Pacific-10 Conference with the Beavers at 1-7.
