year (French) student drops into the library between classes — it was perfect."

Haldane said she also enjoys the high motivation of Honors College students.

"Typically students here are (more) interested in getting a good education," she said, emphasizing that motivation is not a characteristic exclusive to Honors College students.

Barbara Pope, who was appointed as the college's first woman director beginning this fall, said one reason she became interested in working in the college was its small size.

"I can follow a student's career for four or five years," she said. "In the larger university, you have students for one or two classes and then they're gone."

Other benefits of the Honors College include a computer lab of IBM and Apple computers and laser printing free of charge to all Honors College students. The third floor of Chapman also houses a small library equipped with reference works, course texts, literary works, journals and magazines.

Honors College students in need of relaxation head to the Honors College lounge, which includes comfortable couches, a kitchen, a TV set and a chess board perpetually ready for play.

"It's incredible what we have available to us," Haldane said.

The numerous benefits of the Honors College have at times made the college a subject of attack by other University students and faculty, who have claimed the program is elitist. In the late '60s, the problem was so severe that Honors College enrollment dropped significantly, Stevenson said.

But by the mid-'70s, more people than ever were applying.

"It has seemed elitist to some because it gives a few people opportunities I would like everyone to have," Pope said.

"But it is still a public education. Very good students and very committed students can get an Ivy League education in Oregon for \$2,600 a year."

Pope said she is interested in attracting students from a variety of backgrounds to the school,

make a great school, and with that in mind he wants to meet with faculty and students to work on sharpening the school's mission and focus.

"We need to concentrate on what we are good at, rather than trying to be all things to all people," he said.

"I think we have an obligation to our consumers — the students," he said.

The American Bar Association, which withdrew threats to remove the school's accreditation last May, will review the school again in spring 1993. Frohnmayer said the school's self-examination is a standard part of that review process.

Frohnmayer's vision is to have the law school be much more involved with the public, and he wants to educate the public about the service the law school provides.

"We can make a difference, and we have," he said.

The law school has a history of legal reform, Frohnmayer said, and has trained one-third to one-half of Oregon's judges.
