

## Winning streak continues for Oregon wrestling team

The Oregon wrestling team improved its record to a spotless 4-0 Friday with a 25-15 win over Simon Fraser at McArthur Court.

Dan Vidlak and Jarret Clark, two of the top collegiate wrestlers in the 118- and 126-pound classes, respectively, got the Ducks started with big wins. Vidlak topped Selwyn Tam, 19-8, and Clark defeated Tom Petrysehn, 18-6.

Darren Gustafson (158) and Scott Myers (190) also won by large margins over their Simon Fraser opponents. Gustafson was victorious over Derek Lamour, 22-8, and Myers outscored Evan Lavoie, 12-2.

Cory Sonnen, Pat Hirai and Cam Johnston also scored wins for the Ducks.

In a match the evening before at Mac Court, the Ducks landed a 22-15 beating of Notre Dame.

Oregon lost only two matches, but three matches ended in draws, giving the Irish many of their points.

Vidlak, Jason Jones, David Windauer, Myers and Chris Anderson all won for the Ducks. Oregon led only 16-15 before Myers' 5-1 win over Tom Salvino sealed the triumph.

Vidlak, who is 9-1 on the season and ranked third by the *Amateur Wrestling News* in his class, earlier won the MVP of the Oregon Wrestling Classic Dec. 30 at Corvallis. Vidlak won the 118-pound class with a 20-5 win by technical fall over Portland State's Gary Marquez in the championship.

Oregon was the only school to place in every weight class. Jason Muggy (142) and Pat Craig (150) were Oregon's other individual champions of the classic.

"Our kids played hard," Monson said. "And that's all you can ask. We were outmanned. We just couldn't generate enough consistency. If Booker hadn't hit those two long threes in the first half, we'd have been right in it."

Despite losing by a big margin for the third straight game, Oregon did some good things in its final tune-up for Pacific-10 Conference play, which gets under way Thursday night when California comes to McArthur Court for a 7:35 game.

The Ducks' box-and-one zone, with Jordan playing Peeler and getting occasional double-team help, held the All-American to just two free throws in the first half.

And the motion offense worked well against the Tigers' zone, although Oregon managed only four of 18 three-point attempts. That strategy might work well against teams like UCLA, which are nearly unbeatable in a fast-paced game.

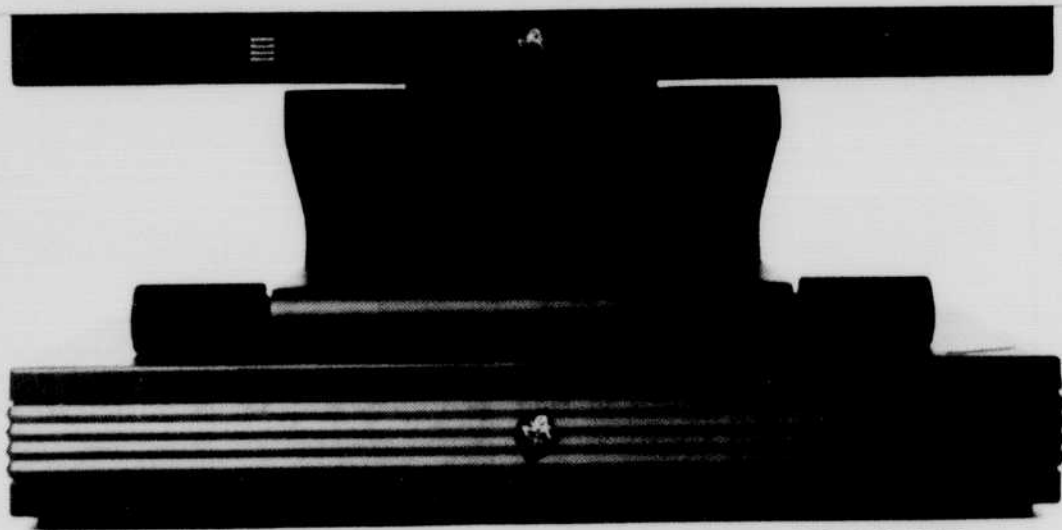

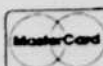
