Football games changed

Hawaii and Nevada at Las Vegas will be added to the 1992 Oregon football schedule because of vacancies left by two other schools.

The Ducks will open next fall's slate with a Sept. 5 game at Autzen Stadium against Hawaii of the Western Athletic Conference, and will tentatively face UNLV of the Big West Conference Sept. 26, also in Eugene.

Oregon athletic director Bill Byrne said schedule changes became necessary after Long Beach State dropped its football program in December and Bowling Green asked to be released from its schedule obligation in 1992.

In addition, the Ducks' Pacific-10 Conference game at Stanford was shifted to Sept. 12 by mutual agreement between the schools to accommodate Oregon's schedule revision. Oregon will play at Hawaii during the 1994 season and is negotiating to play Bowling Green during another season.

The Ducks' revised 1992 schedule is as follows (home games in CAPS): Sept. 5 — HAWAII; Sept. 12 — Stanford; Sept. 19 — TEXAS TECH; Sept. 26 — UNLV; Oct. 3 — ARIZONA STATE; Oct. 10 — Southern Cal; Oct. 17 — WASHINGTON; Oct. 31 — Washington State; Nov. 7 — CALIFORNIA; Nov. 14 — UCLA; Nov. 21 — Oregon State.

Coach resigns

Alison Robertson, a five-year assistant coach for the Duck women's basketball team, resigned in December.

"My priorities have changed since I first entered the coaching profession, and at this stage of my life, I feel that my family must come first," Robertson said in reference to her busband, Gary, and 21-month-old daughter Brie. "The traveling associated with the job became too much to undertake at this time."

Oregon women's head basketball coach Elwin Heiny said Robertson's contribution to the program would be "sorely missed" but announced her replacement for the remainder of the season Richard Lucas, a former Oregon men's standout who completed his eligibility last season, was added to the women's coaching staff

"Alison will certainly be difficult to replace, but I understand her reasoning for wishing to step down at this time and support her decision," Heiny said. "She has meant a lot to this program, as a player as well as a coach, and I will miss her."

The 30-year-old Robertson completed her collegiate career in 1984 as Oregon's all-time scoring leader and second-best rebounder before beginning her second stint at her alma mater as a graduate assistant coach in 1988. She joined Heiny's staff as a full-time assistant the following season.

"I have learned a lot as a player and a coach through Elwin, and he has been a friend to me on and off the court," Robertson said. "I will miss working with the kids but still will be in attendance at every home game."

Softballer honored

The National Softball Coaches Association named Oregon's Kim Manning to the academic All-America squad for 1991.

Manning had a 309 batting average, was second in the Pac-10 with six home runs, had 36 RBIs and scored 39 runs. The senior Health Education major accumulated a 3.66 GPA last year.

To be eligible, a player must maintain at least a 3.50 GPA for the academic year.

Player named all-West

Oregon senior Dawnn Charroin was named to the all-West Region squad in voting done by region volleyball coaches.

Charroin, a four-year starter, was named to the all-Pac-10 team in December. The Ducks' outside hitter led the team in kills, digs and total blocks and ranked among the conference leaders in all three categories.
