which marshall co-chaired in $1989-90$
Marshall was US secretary of lahor
from 1977 to 1981. He holds the Audre and Bernard Rapoport Centennial Chat in Economics and Public affairs at the University of Texas at Austin. He is co author of 25 books and numerous schol
arly articles
Marshall is the 10th occupant of the University's Wayne Morse Chair of Law and Politics, and will co-teach a Univer sity class in labor and economic polic

The Wayne Morse Chair was create In 1978 as a living memorial to the late Oregon senator and former dean of the miversity School of Law The Occu pant is selected by the University pros dent "on the basis of qualities and achievements exemplified in the life of Wayne L. Morse: courage, integrity, in dependence, teaching ability, statesman ship. scholarship and contributions the enhancement of law, representativ, government and world peace.
