Carter's labor secretary to talk about recession tonight

In the face of the current recession, the United States is going to have to make some tough choices along the way to recovery. One of the leaders in the national movement for broader work force development policies has a few ideas of his own.

Ray Marshall, economist, author, teacher and former secretary of labor under President Jimmy Carter will discuss U.S. economic development strategies in a free speech tonight at 7 in the Wilder Room of the Eugene Conference Center at the Hilton, 66 E. 6th Ave.

Marshall's talk, "A High-Wage Strategy for Economic Development," will focus on the need for the United states to adopt a "high quality, high wage, high skills" approach similar to the ones being used by Japan and Europe.

Marshall is co-author of the book America's Choice — High Skills or Low Wages. The book examines the issues of education and training in the United States, and was produced as a report of the findings of the U.S. Commission on

Skills of the American Work Force, which marshall co-chaired in 1989-90.

Marshall was U.S. secretary of labor from 1977 to 1981. He holds the Audre and Bernard Rapoport Centennial Chair in Economics and Public affairs at the University of Texas at Austin. He is co-author of 25 books and numerous scholarly articles.

Marshall is the 10th occupant of the University's Wayne Morse Chair of Law and Politics, and will co-teach a University class in labor and economic policy during winter term.

The Wayne Morse Chair was created in 1978 as a living memorial to the late Oregon senator and former dean of the University School of Law. The Occupant is selected by the University president "on the basis of qualities and achievements exemplified in the life of Wayne L. Morse: courage, integrity, independence, teaching ability, statesmanship, scholarship and contributions to the enhancement of law, representative government and world peace."
