IRS begins assistance programs

The horror, the horror! It's tax time again. Well, almost. But soon enough for the IRS to begin its annual federal tax return assistance program.

Eugene taxpayers can call 1-800-TAX(829)-1040 Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. up until the April 15 filing deadline. The IRS encourages people to call early in the morning and later in the week to avoid a long wait.

Moreover, many other assistance programs are available including walk-in assistance, mail assistance and tele-tax.

Tele-tax is an automated information system that plays prerecorded messages on specific subjects. Callers can call 24 hours a day to 1-800-829-4477.

Mail assistance will be available Feb. 15 at Valley River Center in Eugene or people can receive personal, walk-in assistance at the Eugene IRS office located at 2512 Oakmont Way from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Literacy program seeks help

A program teaching adults to read is seeking volunteers to tutor an average of two hours a

week for three months.

The workplace literacy program, "READ RIGHT" is a pilot program sponsored by Simpson Investment Company. The program is set to begin in January and volunteers must first complete an eight-hour training session.

Openings exist for crisis intervention workers, hotline workers, social services advocates, children's workers, residential program workers and Transition House volunteers.


Womenspace, which is staffed mainly by volunteers, is a community program that provides domestic violence survivors with a place to stay before they return to the community.
