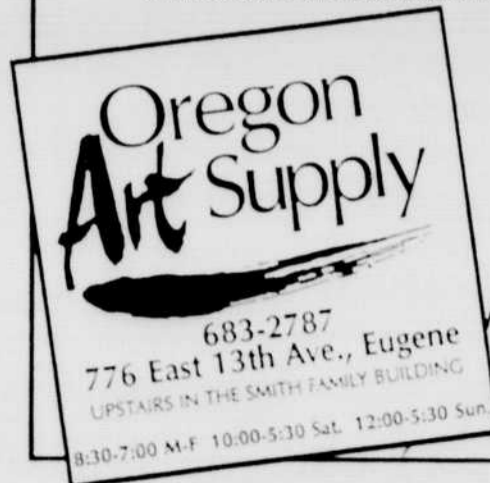

Counsel. "The construction has created a lot of noise and has caused some of the houses to become dirty."

The new residential parking program is a plan arrived at jointly by the University and the city of Eugene, said Carey Drayton, director of the Office of Public Safety.

Drayton said there was a great deal of concern by residents of University-owned family housing in the east campus area about the amount of traffic and the danger that it poses for small children living there.

As a way to deter students and staff from taking advantage of free parking so close to campus, Drayton said the city encouraged the University to implement a residential parking program similar to programs in the south and west University

areas.

Residents who rent from University-owned housing in the east campus area will receive

free parking permits. Those who do not live in University housing will have to pay \$15 per vehicle per year for extended parking beyond the permitted two hours.

Foote said.

In addition to time, another obstacle to environmental activism is that "students are really recognizing the interconnectedness of all these (social) issues together," Hoop said.

For example, students may occasionally feel guilty for working only on saving old-growth forests and not putting energy into combatting racism.

The growing complexity of student environmentalism is being joined by realizations that protest is no longer the effective tool for change it was in the 1960s.

In the 1980s, "student activism shifted away from protest in the streets to dialogue and more mainstream politics," Hoop said. "I can understand it even if in my heart I wish students spoke out more."

"Protests are created to educate, but instead they're scaring people off," Foote said.

Many University students agree. Environmental protesters' "causes are good, but the way they go about it isn't," said Alexandra Zapp, a sophomore political science major. "It offends and puts more people off than it recruits."

"Because environmentalism is an issue whose time has come, we don't have to stage protests," Foote said. "We can talk to people."

Brotine said he's been trying to break down the misconceptions and stereotypes to environmentalists as only radical "freaks" by talking to all different types of people each day.

"I don't like to go out and yell and scream," Foote said, who in her freshman and sophomore years at the University was instrumental in getting reusable mugs put in the dorms. "I feel like I'm not doing anything."

Other students perceive protesters to be ineffective for this reason. "It's blatantly obvious to the whole world how you feel about it, but you're not actually doing something constructive," said Charles Deister, a senior history major.
