I wonder if Pat Malach attended the same Constitution Court hearing that I did (ODE, Dec. 9, 1991). Malach asserts Saferide and the ASUO reacted to Abe Hepner's challenge of its women-only driver and rider policy with "hysteria and power politics."

Yet Hepner appeared to be the only person in the room who was allowed to interrupt

other people's testimony or statements — this from a man who was attempting to eliminate one of the few islands of safety that campus women have in a dangerous environment, and who, with his cohorts, spent a good fraction of his fall term camped out in front of Saferide's office, engaged in behavior that could be construed as an attempt to harass or intimidate Saferide staff.

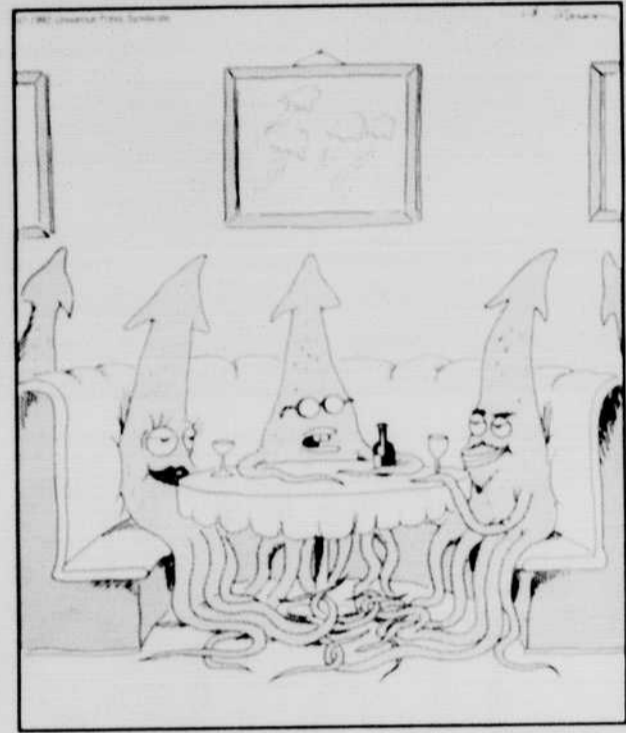
I do not mean to say Hepner
