

USC, UCLA dunk Ducks

Reality in the form of USC and UCLA set in on Oregon this weekend, as the Trojans and Bruins trounced the Ducks at Los Angeles.

Before the losses, the Ducks, 8-4 overall and off to an 0-2 start in the Pacific-10 Conference, had played well in spite of injuries and occasional sloppiness. The Trojans and Bruins let Oregon get away with nothing.

USC especially crushed the Ducks Sunday, breaking a three-game Duck win streak, 83-55. It was Oregon's worst loss to the Trojans since a 91-57 defeat in 1983 at Los Angeles.

The Trojans improved to 8-3 overall and are 2-0 in the conference.

All USC starters scored in double figures with Lisa Leslie leading the way. The sophomore scored 18 points, making 6 of 8 shots from the floor.

Matching that game-high total was Oregon's Staci Wallenborn, who made 5 of 10 shots for her 18 points. The senior also finished with seven rebounds to lead the game.

Wallenborn had the only hot hand on Oregon's team Sunday, as the Ducks shot a dismal 33 percent from the floor. USC, on the other hand, made 50 percent of its field goals.

UCLA beat Oregon Friday, 91-72, in both teams' Pac-10 opener. The Bruin win was a repeat performance of last year's 93-67 thrashing of the Ducks at Los Angeles.

Oregon did, however, keep the Bruins' explosive Rehema Stephens in check. The senior, who is averaging more than 18 points a game, did finish with 16 points, but she made only 8 of her 21 shots from the floor.

The final score was not entirely indicative of the game, as the Ducks played close through the entire first half, trailing only 43-38 at halftime.

In the end, though, shooting seemed to play the largest role in the outcome. UCLA finished shooting 52 percent for the game, but Oregon made only 40 percent of its shots.

Wallenborn played another outstanding game for Oregon, hitting 8 of 15 shots for 20 points. Missy Stowell added 17 points for the Ducks.

Stoudamire finished the half with 14 points, and only Jordan and Patterson (four points each) and Johnnie Reece (one basket, his only points of the game) helped the 6-foot-5 junior, who is quickly becoming Oregon's leader.

Reece showed continued progress and poise at the point guard position, even though he made just one of seven field goal attempts.

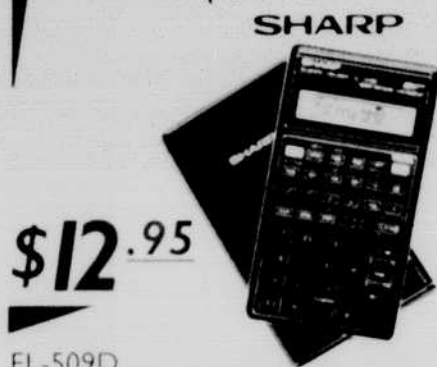
And Patterson had his second straight solid performance, scoring nine points and pulling down eight rebounds.

But heading into this week's games at second-ranked and undefeated UCLA —

which ended sixth-ranked Arizona's 71-game home winning streak Saturday — and USC, Oregon has to get more offense from Reece and Williams, who combined for just three of 14 field goal attempts against Stanford.

The Ducks open up a Southern California road swing Thursday night at 7:35 against UCLA at Pauley Pavilion.
