

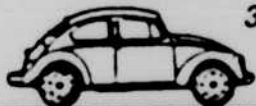

## Club hockey iced on road

After never leading during a three-game sweep in Seattle last weekend, the Oregon club hockey team is eager to host California this Saturday at 6 p.m. and Sunday at 10 a.m. at Lane County Ice.

The Golden Bears will seek to settle the score with Oregon, which beat them 2-1 at Berkeley in November.

"The last meeting was very physical ... even blood[y]," defenseman Jeremy Kaplan recalls. "We expect more of the same this weekend."

Oregon could have used some of the same intensity in Washington. The Cold Ducks lost twice to Washington, 4-3 and 4-1, and to British Columbia Bible College, 4-2, over a three-day stretch.

Prior to leaving on the trip, the Ducks also received news that head coach Mike Sobol will no longer be with them. Sobol said he has set out to do what he planned and wanted to spend more time with his wife and three-month-old baby.

"We've taken the program to a level where it is solid financially and has solid players and a solid schedule," Sobol said.

Assistant coach Shane Peters will take over as coach for the rest of the season.

Because of the sudden change, Oregon journeyed to Seattle minus a coach. Wings Mike Rousell and Tom Lerra also missed the trip to concentrate on academics.

Saturday's game was played in an old Thriftway store converted to an ice rink.

After falling behind 4-0 to the Huskies, the Ducks exploded for three goals in one minute, including wing Peter Komivos' first of the year. But the manic minute wasn't enough, as the Ducks eventually fell, 4-3.

Despite playing where detergent and canned foods were once sold, captain Scott Brown said it was "a typical environment, except for the 'Thank you for shopping' sign."

The only highlight in the next two Duck defeats was wing Brian Clendenin's first goal of the year, coming in the final period of a 4-1 loss.

But since the program's inception 18 months ago, Sobol has seen the Ducks take some major strides.

"When I first came here, the team had no organized practices, no captains and no real effort to get people in the stands," Sobol said.

All that has changed now, and on Saturday the team will finally replace the pre-game tape of "The Star-Spangled Banner" with a live performance by Andrea Yates of the Eugene-based band Lazoo. Yates will sing "America the Beautiful."
