State board to hear report on women

The Oregon State Board of Higher Education is meeting today at Portland State, with an agenda that includes a report of the status of women, pay raises for the chancellor and institution presidents and a school re-

Board President George Richardson Jr. will present the board's annual salary report recommending a 3 percent cost of living salary increase for Chancellor Thomas Bartlett and the eight state system institution presidents.

In light of Measure 5, merit raises are being reserved for faculty and staff below the rank of vice president/executive

This increase would raise University President Myles Brand's salary and expenses to \$128,292 from the current \$124,548. The three percent raise is the same cost of living increase given to all state em-

The board will also hear a final report on the status of women in the Oregon State System of Higher Education.

In 1985, the board issued a policy statement on equal opportunity, with the intent that women and minority students be appropriately represented in academic programs, administration and faculty. Administrative rules on this issue were adopted in 1986.

The report being presented at today's board meeting provides a profile of enrollment and employment by gender in three major areas:

- · Comparative enrollment, financial support and academic preparation of students.
- · Gender distribution of faculty and administrative staff by rank and by salary.
- · Institutional climate factors such as curriculum development, research support, staff

professional development and work-family options.

Women now make up 50 percent of all undergraduates in the state system, and 48 percent of graduate students, less than the national average.

Shirley Clark, vice chancellor for academic affairs, will report on higher education's role in HB 3565, the Oregon Education Act for the 21st Century

The report includes a proposal to commit higher education funds that will support higher education faculty working with Oregon school districts on individual pilot projects.
