is made in an official capacity.

"As I contended from the beginning, my sole intent in this manner, as with all of my actions as president of the University of Oregon, was to serve the best interests of the University, the region and the state," Brand said.

Also on Friday, the State Board of Higher Education approved 3 percent cost-of-living increases for Chancellor Tom Bartlett and the eight state system institution presidents.

Brand, Oregon State University President John Byrne and Portland State University President Judith Ramaley will each receive salaries of \$113,556, with an additional \$14,736 for expenses.

Bartlett will receive an annual salary of \$129,780, plus \$30,036 for expenses and housing.

The presidents of Eastern Oregon, Southern Oregon, and Western Oregon state colleges, and Oregon Institute of Technology will each receive \$90,456 salaries and \$9,084 for expenses.

Peter Kohler, president of Oregon Health Sciences University and the highest-paid president in the state system, will receive \$127,968 and \$14,736 for expenses.

The salary increases were limited to the cost of living, with no merit pay, because of the state's financial situation.
