tion that they speak for their entire race, but also on each student's unique childhood experiences.

These interviews provide much more than one can usually get by listening to a panel discussion or casual conversations, Lesage said.

"If you talk to someone for an hour or so, you realize how much insight they have," she said. "You can get so much more than you can from day-to-day contact."

Lesage said she is pleased with the outcome of the interviews and the opportunity to give the students a voice.

"I hope it will show others that there is another voice to be heard out there," Lesage said.

Jon Motohiro, a Japanese-American student who contributed, spoke about coming to Eugene from Hawaii, where Asians and Pacific-Americans are the majority, as well as his own education here about students of other colors.

"I was really excited about this project," Motohiro said, "not because I wanted to be on

videotape and see myself up there, but because I wanted to help make this project work."

In addition to having more in-depth exposure than a panel discussion would provide, another benefit is the longevity of the interviews on film.

"A panel discussion you can forget, but this will always be there," Motohiro said. "I can only hope that people will take note of it, take it for what it is and listen to it and not dismiss it as a bunch of students of color griping. I want people to see the faces and hear the experiences."

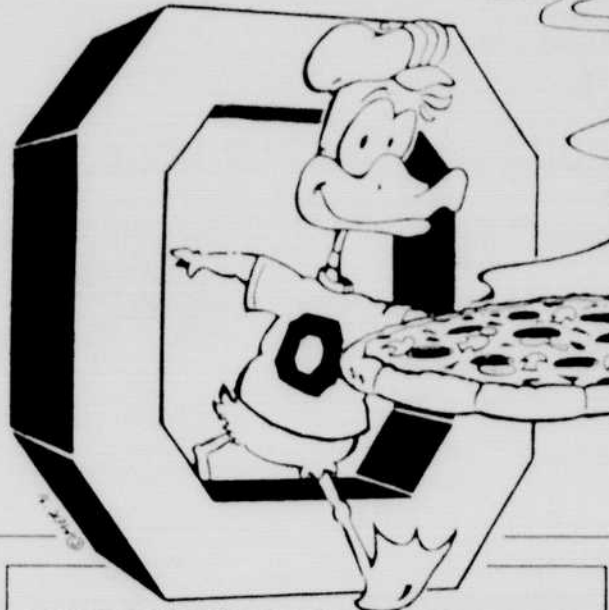
