Duke set for Oregon primary ballot



SALEM (AP) — Former Ku Klux Klan leader David Duke will be on Oregon's Republican presidential primary ballot in May, Secretary of State Phil Keisling said Tuesday.

Oregon Republican Chairman Craig Berkman had urged Keisling to keep Duke off the ballot, saying that Duke is interested only in promoting hate and racism.

But Keisling said despite his personal opposition to

Duke's political views, Duke met the standards necessary to be listed on Oregon's ballot.

By law, the secretary of state is required to list a candidate who is "generally advocated or is recognized in national news media." A candidate also can gain a ballot spot by petition.

The other Republicans who will be on Oregon's primary ballot will be George Bush and conservative columnist

Pat Buchanan.

On the Democratic ticket will be former California Gov. Jerry Brown, Arkansas Gov. Bill Clinton, Sen. Tom Harkin of Iowa, Sen. Bob Kerrey of Nebraska and former Sen. Paul Tsongas of Massachusetts.

Berkman issued a statement in which he said that including Duke on Oregon's ballot "recalls the dark days of America's civil rights movement."
