Liebert's overpowering style has provided him with plenty of two-minute visits to the penalty box over the course of the season. Last weekend Liebert was whistled for five roughing penalties and spent 10 minutes in confinement in one game.

"When I'm on the ice I don't think about the consequences before I check somebody," Liebert said.

Liebert's been going about his method of assaulting oppos-

ing skaters during his 15 years of organized competition.

"When I got old enough to play competitively (at age 5), my uncle got me all the necessary equipment and signed me up," Liebert said.

"Only once has an opponent been taller than me, but even then he didn't have my size," said Liebert, who spent six months competing on the Junior B level in Seattle before returning to Oregon.

"(Playing Junior B) was a good experience," Liebert said. "I got to travel to Canada to play, but I didn't really like the

living arrangements. When I heard Oregon was starting up a team, I figured that playing while having a chance to get an education was the best thing for me."

Even though teammates are glad that Liebert returned to his place of birth to play, they are constantly on the lookout during weekly team workouts.

Oregon wing Mike McHugh says that avoiding Liebert in practice has become somewhat of a strict safety code among the Ducks.

"Hitting Mark is like hitting an outhouse," McHugh said.

But Oregon hasn't won three-straight Pac-10 road games since the 1986-87 season, and the Ducks are hurting from injuries in a bad way. Seven players are either out or doubtful for tonight's game.

Debbie Sporcich's foot injury will keep her out for a predicted two more weeks, and a bacterial infection will

keep Iesha Smith out for the rest of the season.

Coach Hill isn't going to let Oregon State give the Ducks an inch, though, no matter how injured they may be. She is particularly concerned about Oregon center Sara Wilson and the problems Wilson may create.

"They're going to be ready for us, especially after last time," Wilson said. "They're going to want us."
