

# French Creek II: Headin' out West



**INTO THE  
OUTDOORS**

Last week I started a two-part series on the French Creek valley in the Old Cascades east of Salem. Last week's column dealt with the eastern side of the valley, and today I'll talk about some of the interesting places on the western side.

Drive to the French Creek road by taking Highway 22 east of Salem to the Breitenbush River bridge just before entering Detroit. Take this paved road to the left and drive four miles, where the pavement runs out.

Then turn left at the "Y" junction, which leads steeply uphill. Although the road is steep, it's neither narrow nor rough. Because of variable snow conditions it might not be possible to reach the two trailheads I'll describe, but it's an easy trip with cross-country skis or on foot.

Whichever way you go, continue on the main road about four miles from the end of the pavement. Just after climbing two consecutive switchbacks, take the second road to the right. The first spur road, the one to avoid, goes downhill and past a small pond. The one you want continues almost parallel with the main road for a short distance and is level.

Follow this road through a small clearing and past a power-line tower to the end of the road. From here the Cedar Lake trail leads north and south.

Heading south, the trail leads down French Creek ridge to Cedar Lake, and then back up to the other trailhead described last week.

But a more interesting goal is just one-quarter mile north: Phantom Natural Bridge. This rock arch, about 20 feet high and 15 feet across, can be reached by a short spur of the main trail, only about a five-minute walk from the end of the road.

Cedar Lake can be seen through the arch, as well as the East fork of the French Creek road above Opal Lake. Although Phantom Bridge is one of the few natural bridges in Oregon and it's prominently shown on the Willamette National Forest map, many people haven't actually seen it.

Care should be taken when walking around the arch, though, especially in wet or icy conditions. There is some moderate exposure.

Once you've seen the natural bridge — and if you weren't stopped too far down the road by snow — head back to the main road and continue about a half-mile farther to Knutson Saddle.

As you reach the summit of the ridge, where the road starts to head south, look on the left side of the road for the Dome Rock/Tumble Lake trailhead. The trail is fairly easy to see because it takes off from a wide spot in the road.

The trail heads south a short distance before reaching a junction. The south fork of the trail heads downhill about a mile to Tumble Lake, a five-acre pool

that sits at the base of high cliffs. A loop trip is possible here, as the trail (it's actually an old road past the lake) leads down the Tumble Creek canyon to Highway 22. The highway trailhead is just about a mile before the French Creek road junction.

The alternate trip — and the one to take on a clear day — winds up the slopes of Dome Rock to the 4,859-foot summit. This moderately difficult trail is just over a mile long, but it climbs in mostly gradual switchbacks up open rock slopes to the top.

The view from the broad, flat summit is extensive, ranging from Mt. Hood to the north and Mt. Jefferson, Three Fingered Jack, Mt. Washington and the Three Sisters farther south.

The steep northern slopes of Dome Rock are impressive, too. The view here takes in Cedar Lake as well as the entire Little North Fork valley to the west. On exceptionally clear days the rolling hills of the Coast Range can be seen, as well.

None of these trails to Phantom Bridge, Tumble Lake or Dome Rock are suited for cross-country skiing. But they aren't difficult for hikers or those with snowshoes, especially the shorter trail to Phantom Bridge.

As with the eastern side of the French Creek valley, visitors are usually rare on the western side, making the entire area ideal for outdoor enthusiasts who don't have the time for extended trips into wilderness areas but who want to have an area all to themselves.


