

The Oregon men's golf team expects a top-20 ranking when the polls come out next week, after an impressive sixth-place finish in last weekend's Big Island Intercollegiate at Wiakaloa, Hawaii.

The Ducks went into the tourney ranked 24th in the nation but finished ahead of eight teams currently ranked in the top 20. Among these teams were Pacific-10 Conference rivals Arizona and USC, ranked second and 16th, respectively, as well as seventh-ranked BYU and No. 8 New Mexico.

"We finished above what I expected," new head coach Shawn Aicher said. "They all played well and were relaxed."

Leading the Ducks was senior Doug DuChateau, who shot a 15-over par 231, tying him for 18th. The scores were higher than normal due to strong winds that averaged between 30-40 miles per hour both days and at times reached as high as 50 mph.

Nobody finished under par for the three-round tournament as Oklahoma State's Alan Bratton won the event with a 4-over par 220. No. 5 UNLV won the team title by two strokes over third-ranked Oklahoma State, with the Ducks coming in 26 shots off the pace.

We feel like we played bad and still finished sixth, so we're pretty happy," junior Jeff Lyons said.

This year's Duck squad has five seniors, including DuChateau, Mark Aldrich, Troy Tamiya and James Chrisman, who all went to Hawaii along with Lyons.


"Experience is the strength of our team," Aicher said. "This is the strongest traveling team we have.

Oregon got the nation's attention during the fall season when they beat a strong field in the Robertson-Holmes Intercollegiate at Stockton, Calif. They broke the NCAA Division I record for best 36 holes by a fourman team in the process by shooting 34-under par. Aldrich won the tournament, giving himself a legitimate shot at an All-American berth.

The Ducks are off until March 7 and 8 when they host the Duck Invitational at Eugene Country Club and Emerald Valley Golf Course.
