Abdul-Quadir Shanwar, now a graduate student at Colorado State University, will be in the EMU Ben Linder Room at 1:30 p.m.

Ziyad Abdessalam, director of the Muslim Student Association, said Shanwar will speak about many different issues, including the effects of Western sanctions on the people of Iraq, rebuilding the country after the bombings, the role of the Israelis and Iranians, opposition parties within Iraq, and the Middle East peace talks.

APASU sponsors bone marrow search

The Asian/Pacific American Student Union will host a bone marrow donor testing drive tomorrow for people of Asian ancestry between 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. in the EMU Walnut Room.

APASU co-director Gary Hoh said he became aware of the acute need for Asian marrow donors last year when he heard about a Korean-American student's search for a donor for her brother who had a fatal blood disease.

According to National Marrow Donor Program Registry statistics, there are now 148 Asian Americans who need transfusions because of disease.

However, the pool of potential donors for Asian Americans and all minorities is small, Hoh said. According to NMDPR, only about 5 percent of the half-million registered donors are of Asian ancestry. People of the same racial background are more likely to match.
