hind my back and threw me on the ground," Beebe said. "He was twisting for awhile before he put the handcuffs on."

Scarborough said he didn't use excessive force when arresting Beebe.

"He's probably in his 60's," Scarborough said. "There was no need to use excessive force. There was no need. The gentleman was cooperative."

Scarborough said safety officers are taught to handcuff people on the ground rather than standing up.

Peter Condon, a geology graduate teaching fellow who witnessed the incident, said Scarborough could have avoid-

ed being hit by not stepping in front of Beebe's bike.

"The officer could have stopped the man without a violent collision," Condon said. "I question the use of force. It looked unnecessary for the circumstances."

Beebe faces a charge of Assault Four. Assault Four, a Class A misdemeanor, occurs when a person intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly causes physical injury to another, according to state law. Assault Four carries maximum penalties of a \$2500 fine or one year in jail.

Beebe said he didn't know yet what he would plead to the assault charge when he appears in court March 9. He said he wouldn't charge Scarborough with excessive force.

Shanwar said mistakes have been made by the Iraqi government, but he wants Iraqis to make the changes within their own country.

The audience member then said Iraqi citizens have been trying to get rid of Hussein for decades and that the real destruction has come from him.

Another audience member from the Middle East said Americans don't understand the difference between conquering and reunification.

Shanwar agreed, and said that Kuwait is historically a province of Iraq and the emir of Kuwait was taking too much oil from the oil field that straddles the two countries.

Shanwar said he believes Iraq needs to be reformed into a multiparty system, but opposes the U.S. policy of dividing Iraq into two sections, with one for the Kurds.

"The Iraqi government would like to see the Kurdish problem solved," he said, "but we are all Iraqis and if there is a Kurdish problem, it is an Iraqi problem."

photographs, and those have been pieced together from multiple surveys.

Bothun said Pine Mountain's location 25 miles east of Bend is the perfect place to complete such a survey because of the generally clear sky and good weather, allowing 100 to 150 nights a year for study.

A further goal of Bothun's is for Pine Mountain to become the focus of a large public education program.

A grant is now in place to connect the observatory with various Oregon colleges via a computer inter-link. This would allow students and faculty to access the telescopes from computer terminals. They could then manipulate the telescope's movement and analyze the image on their screen.

As Bothun sees it, the main obstacles to achieving this goal are time, money and ambition.

"Basically, someone has to prove that this is a manageable program," he said. "We have a

facility waiting to do it. What we need is funding."

Achieving the project would make Pine Mountain the only observatory in the world to offer the computer inter-link.

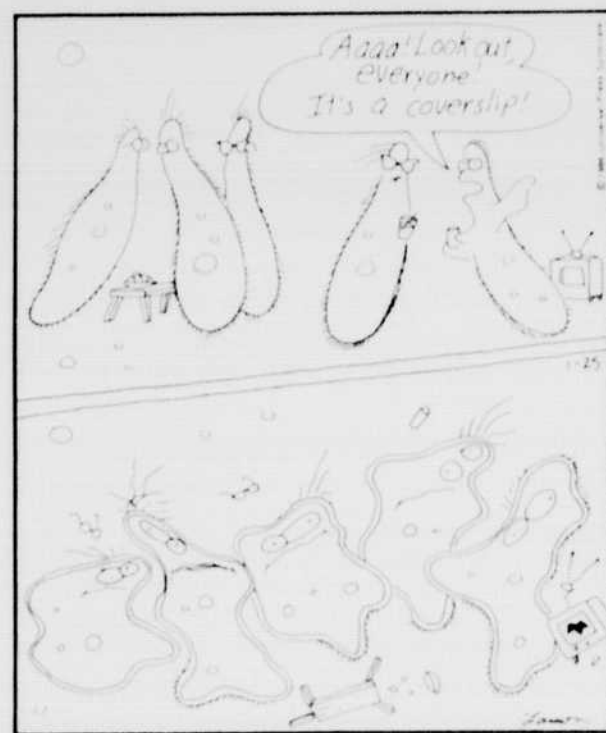
