POLICE BEAT

The following incidents were reported to the Office of Public Safety and the Eugene Police Department Feb. 12-19.

· Police suspect a 21-year-old University student may be responsible for a theft at the University's School of Journalism Feb. 13, according to police reports. A Journalism school accountant reported a cash box stolen from her desk in Room 210 Allen Hall.

According to police, the accountant said her desk drawer is usually locked but the key was in the lock at the time of the theft. About two hours later, a employee from the printing department in Ailen Hall found the cash box on the south side of the building. A few pennies and dimes were the only items left in the box.

Police said the theft amounted to cash and checks totaling \$170. Police have no other suspect information.

· Police arrested an 18-year-old University freshman for stealing a bicycle and breaking a campus lamp Feb. 15, according to police reports. When an officer asked if the man had been drinking he said, "No." But the officer said the mansmelled of alcohol.

The man said he broke the standing lamp outside of Johnson Hall, but said it was an accident, according to police. He said, "I tried to hang the bicycle on the top of the lamp when the whole thing fell over.

When an officer asked the man why he stole the bike he said, "For the heck of it.

The man was charged with theft and criminal mischief, according to police.

· A University Inn resident assistant reported a case of criminal mischief at the UI to police Feb. 16, according to police records. An on-duty R.A. called in a complaint that someone had smeared blood on the door of the UI's elevator and dripped blood on the elevator's floor.

Another on-duty R.A. said she saw a 19-year-old UI resident bleeding in the lobby, according to police. She said there was blood on the walls near the man's room.

No one answered when police knocked on the resident's door, according to police. The suspect and a friend came down the hall and the suspect walked into his room. The man refused to give his name, was very uncooperative, and did not want to answer the officer when questioned.

The officer read the man his rights and was preparing to handcuff him when he decided to tell the police he didn't have to go to jail, according to police. The officer gave the man a citation. He went into his room and slammed the door. Police said he had a cut on his left index finger and an officer saw blood on the finger.
