

Teenagers using stage to teach people about AIDS

Disturbing issues are often difficult to talk about. But the AIDS Prevention Teen Troop has mastered the skill by blending humor with seriousness.

As part of the ASUO-sponsored "Personal Health and Safety" winter symposium, the teen theater group will be performing various skits that focus on the prevention of AIDS tonight at 7 in the EMU Ben Linder Room.

Most of the students involved in the group are from South Eugene High School.

Cory Fox, a University student and peer health adviser

for the Lifestyles Planning Program, is responsible for organizing the event. He said the group's strong point is its relaxed manner in portraying a serious issue.

"The group shows the importance of HIV issues through the medium of theater, serious humor and entertainment," Fox said. "These are serious issues but they perform them in a funny and relaxed manner."

The group will perform several skits dealing with many different issues of AIDS such as risk behavior, gay issues and drug issues — all relating to the prevention of AIDS.

The primary focus is ultimately on behavior, said

Miriam Mitchell, director and coordinator for the teen theater group.

"The skits are about risky and safe behavior," Mitchell said. "It's about communication and making choices. The skits are about situations that one might be in and the choices they may be forced to make."

Following the hour-long skit performances, the group will offer a panel of questions and answers about AIDS.

The theater group funds itself by charging a performance fee.

Sponsoring the campus event is the ASUO, the Lifestyles Planning Program in the Student Health Center and the Health Education Department.
