attackers. The other attacker asked the first assailant why he wanted him to take off his shoes. An argument ensued between the assailants over whether or not the victim should take off his shoes.

At this point, the victim said he ran from the attackers and was pursued for about 30 yards before the assailants gave up. He walked about half a block before he noticed

he was bleeding heavily from an abdominal wound.

The victim walked to the Sacred Heart General Hospital emergency room and was released later that day.

The victim described the assailants as nervous, jumpy and irrational during the attack. Throughout the incident, one of the assailants repeatedly displayed a knife.

The victim was interviewed by police at the hospital, but said he was in shock and

did not want to talk to the officer.

Police reports state the victim was cooperative at first, but later became belligerent. Eventually, the victim refused to be interviewed unless a lawyer or his father was present. He also did not want police to take pictures of the knife wound.

"I wasn't sure I wanted to talk to police at that point," the victim said. "I was just paranoid, but that's typical of me around cops."
