Memorial fund started for University graduate

A Womenspace Shelter memorial fund has been set up in the name of a 1990 University graduate who died Feb. 24 in Hawaii.

Elizabeth Ann Matsch, who was called Betsy by her friends, was participating in a research project with the Student Conservation Association and the Fish and Wildlife Service in Hawaii at the time of her death. Matsch died after falling into a 20-foot crack near the Kilauea Crater in the Hawaiian National Park. She was 24.

A co-worker of Matsch also fell into the crack but was able to pull himself out, said Peter Drake, Matsch's former boyfriend. Matsch was trapped and killed instantly when she inhaled hot fumes emitting from

the crack.

Drake said many people will miss Matsch.

"She touched many lives," Drake said. "Betsy will always live within me and the people she knew. She had a wisdom beyond her years and a true, natural spirit that will live on."

Matsch volunteered at the Womenspace Shelter for a year, said Pearl Wolfe, Womenspace Shelter's 1990 volunteer coordinator. Matsch also volunteered at the Oregon Student Public Interest Research Group and served on the organization's board of directors.

Greeks help sick kids

Delta Upsilon took back to Corvallis a second place trophy and the most spirited award.

Proceeds collected from T-shirt sales, entry fees and sponsor donations will raise close to \$1,000 for the Children's Miracle Network, said Karen Johnson, tournament planner. The Children's Miracle Network assists Sacred Heart in providing vital medical care and equipment for children.

Seventeen local sponsors supported the tournament, including the Downtown Athletic Club, Eugene Hilton, Webfoot and KSND. KSND radio station broadcasted live from the final game and donated CD's to the top teams.
