Golf teams take tourney wins into spring season

Oregon's men's and women's golf teams are both coming off strong finishes in tournaments earlier this week that have them optimistic about the spring season.

The men finished second in the Duck Invitational on Tuesday, five shots behind San Jose State. They were led by junior Jeff Lyons, who shot a 2-underpar 214 for the two-day event, winning the tournament by four strokes.

The Ducks are still awaiting the first polls of the spring season to see if they have moved up from the 24th spot they held following the fall season. Since those polls, Oregon finished sixth against a strong field in Hawaii and second in its tournament.

Oregon will travel south over spring break to compete in the George Buzzini Sr.,/Stanislaus Invitational in Turlock, Ca., March 23 and 24.

The Oregon women's team finished third this week in the Utah-Dixie Women's Classic. The Ducks were led by senior Leigh Hornung, who finished tied for ninth place with rounds of 81, 77 and 77.

The Ducks are currently ranked 33rd but defeated many teams ahead of them at the tournament. Coach Renee Baumgartner was excited with her team's performance in Utah and feels the team is playing as well as it has all season.

"It was one of our best tournaments all year," she said. "We really played well."

The Ducks' next action will be in Oregon State's tournament April 10 and 11. Oregon won the tournament last year, and Baumgartner feels her team should be ready to make a run at the title again this year.

"I'm not sure if we've had our strongest five players play yet," she said. "Hopefully we'll have our best five playing in April."

Oregon has been lead by Hornung all season, and she now has a chance to go to nationals. If she does it would be the first time an Oregon women golfer has ever gone to a championship event.

"Leigh still has to do well at Oregon State and in the Pac-10 Championships," Baumgartner said. "However, she has always played those courses well."

Vikings, Ducks may meet


PORTLAND (AP) — Portland State and Oregon may meet in football for the first time ever, officials of both schools say.

The proposal calls for the Vikings to play the Ducks in a season opener on Sept. 3, 1994, at Autzen Stadium in Eugene.

"We're close to getting it worked out," Portland State athletic director Roy Love said. "It's just some small details in the contract that we need to get finalized and signed off."

Love said Oregon athletic director Bill Byrne initiated the proposal, saying the Ducks had an open date.

Oregon has been reluctant in the past to play Portland State, in part because of NCAA regulations that stipulate bowl teams must have six victories against Division I-A competition.
