Governor of Louisiana and U.S. Senate together raised more than \$5 million and won 1.3 million votes.

Keisling added that Duke, "may not get the press he may want, but he has been recognized as a candidate for the Republican nomination.

"David Duke has more name recognition than Pat Buchanan," Keisling said.

Keisling said the race-baiting of Buchanan, who has more mainstream Republican support, is similar to Duke's tactics.

Berkman at first conceded that charge, but later back-pedaled during a question and answer period.

There is a significant difference between Duke and Buchanan," Berkman said, "but Buchanan has said some things that make people concerned, myself included."

Keisling stressed that having Duke on the Oregon ballot does not mean the state is advocating or supporting him.

'Legitimacy doesn't come by getting on the ballot," Keisling

said, "but by getting public support." Keisling said Duke's message is better brought out in the

open so it can be refuted.

When we put this kind of politics into the sunshine, it cannot flourish like it does in the dark," Keisling said.

The debate was put on by the Rubicon Society, a moderate group of mainstream Republicans.


