

# Autos collide as I-5 oil spill cleanup continues

**NORTHWEST** JEFFERSON (AP) — Traffic backed up four to five miles and two minor accidents were reported Monday morning on Interstate 5 as motorists gawked at the cleanup of a gasoline spill along the roadway, state police said.

Highway officials said a crew of about five people using a backhoe and two trucks continued cleaning up the 1,460 gallons of gasoline spilled Sunday when a Truax Oil Inc. tanker truck was wrecked near Jefferson.

"And in the process we're getting people going both north and southbound that are rubbernecking and having fender-benders," Lt. Andrew Olson said.

"Of course it doesn't help that the Santiam Bridge in the southbound lanes north of the wreck is being worked on," he said.

The bridge construction site

is just one mile north of the wrecked truck along I-5, the state's main north-south artery.

Both accidents Monday were minor and no one was injured, Olson said.

"No, it's just slow movement of traffic and then someone else isn't paying attention to the rear of the car in front of them and that's when you get your minor fender-benders," he said.

The freeway was closed for about 12 hours following the accident at 5:25 a.m. Sunday with traffic backed up seven to eight miles. The truck was headed from Portland to Millersburg when it struck a guardrail and a small cement bridge, then ran off the road. The impact punctured one of the fuel tanks.

The amount spilled was only a small portion of the 10,000 gallons the truck carried, said Don Jordan, assistant district manager with the Oregon Transportation Department.

# Roberts as Clinton's running mate?

SALEM (AP) — Gov. Barbara Roberts said Monday she finds it flattering that she's been mentioned by some as a possible running mate if Arkansas Gov. Bill Clinton clinches the presidential nomination.

But Roberts said she has a full slate of problems to deal with in Oregon and doesn't expect that she'll actually get the nod.

"Nobody ever says 'never.' But it's certainly not anything that I'm seeking or that I even think is realistic," she said in an interview.

On a related subject, the Democratic governor said she doesn't think Clinton has been hurt politically by his disclosure that he tried marijuana once or twice while attending college in Britain in 1968-69.

"It would probably be very hard to find a large number of people who went to college in the 1960s who could say with honesty that they had not participated in the use of marijuana," Roberts said. "I don't think it's a major issue."

Roberts has been mentioned in recent weeks by some Democratic leaders and political consultants as someone Clinton could choose as his running mate if he wanted to balance the ticket on the basis of gender.

Even so, Roberts said she isn't putting much stock into what she called idle chatter by political observers.

"It's always nice and flattering to be suggested as I have by some for this position," she said. "But it's very early in the cards. We don't even have a nominee yet."

Roberts, who as governor will be an automatic delegate to the Democratic National Convention in July, has been chosen as co-chair of the convention's credentials committee.

Roberts said she hasn't committed to any candidate yet, but likely will support Clinton.

Roberts said she doubts that Clinton and his advisors would pick a running mate from a relatively small state like Oregon.

"I think they're going to look for a state that has more electoral votes and a larger number of voters," she said.

At any rate, Roberts said she's having to deal with too many issues in Oregon to give much thought to the possibility of ending up on the Democratic presidential ticket.

"Oregon has never had more difficult problems on its plate than it does right now with Measure 5, the spotted owl timber crisis, the salmon and fishing issue and the drought in Eastern and Central Oregon," she said.

Roberts also noted that she's the target of a recall campaign that's being pushed by people who blame her for various ills facing the state.
