HIGHER ED UPDATE

University wins grant

The Henry Luce Foundation Inc., of New York awarded the University a \$95,000 grant for the development of its Southeast Asian library collection and for student fellowships related to the study of Southeast Asia.

Henry Luce III, the foundation's chairman and chief executive officer, said the grant is part of an overall award of \$280,000 to the Northwest Regional Consortium for Southeast Asian Studies from the Luce Fund for Southeast Asian Studies.

The U.S. Department of Education has designated the consortium, which consists of the universities of Oregon, Washington and British Columbia, as one of only five National Resource Centers for Southeast Asian Studies.

"The designation by the Department of Education gives us recognition as a national leader in Southeast Asian Studies, and the Luce Foundation grant further confirms that reputation," said Gerald Fry, director of the University's International Studies and Southeast Asian Studies programs.

Of the \$95,000 grant, \$65,000 is designated for the Southeast Asian collection in the University's Knight Library, and \$30,000 is for student fellowships.

Kathleen Bowman, University vice provost for international affairs, said that such grants have also allowed the University to expand the number of Southeast Asian studies courses available to

both graduate and undergraduate students.

Student wins ad contest

University junior Jennifer Huckins won first prize in a national contest for advertising students sponsored by the Alliance for Environmental Education.

Huckins, a journalism major, competed against 33 regional winners for the national honor, will receive \$500 and expense-paid trips for herself and her academic adviser to the national convention of the American Academy of Advertising, one of the contest coordinators.

At the convention, associate professor of advertising Bill Ryan, Huckins' adviser, will accept a \$500 grant to the University School of Journalism.

The contest drew 4,200 contestants in 11 regional contests around the country. A panel of advertising professionals and academics judged students' entries.

Huckins' winning entry, prepared for the ad copywriting course taught by Ryan, is a newspaper public service advertising campaign urging readers to show greater respect for forests by recycling paper products. It includes three separate advertising layouts with photos and copy.

Ryan said Huckins' ads will be printed and distributed to newspapers nationwide, which may decide to publish one or more of them as public service messages.

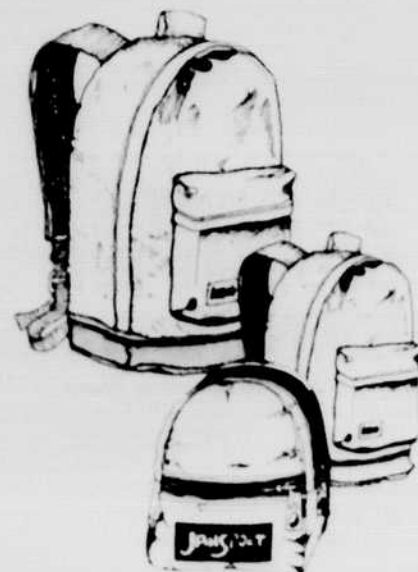
