grandchildren is that they won't have to pay a lot of money to learn about something they are interested in," Jardine said at the conclusion of his talk.

Brand had even harsher words, saying that Oregon is on a collision course between demographic trends that require greater access to higher education, and current decisions that downsize education.

Back at the president's office, Brand changed into jeans, a T-shirt and athletic shoes for his stint as a student.

"I'm going to the bookstore for you, here's my mail," he told Jardine, pointing to a stack of about 20 thick file folders. "Have it done by the end of the day."

While Brand was off to buy textbooks and change a grading option, "President" Jardine headed off to inspect the Knight Library expansion with University Vice President Dan Williams.

Jardine went back to Johnson Hall to meet with his staff at about the time Brand was off to his 2:30 vocal jazz class. "Student" Brand was five minutes late, but, to his credit, two students showed up even later.

Brand stood around the piano with the other 11 students and did voice warm-ups, de-

spite his self-admitted lack of vocal prowess.

"When I was in Sunday School, singing in the choir, they put me in the back row and told me to hum, because I couldn't carry a tune," Brand said.

The class moved into improvisation exercises, with GTF Mark Tuning singing a bar, followed by each student in succession.

Notices of events with a donation or admission charge will not be accepted. Campus events and those scheduled nearer the publication date will be given priority.




