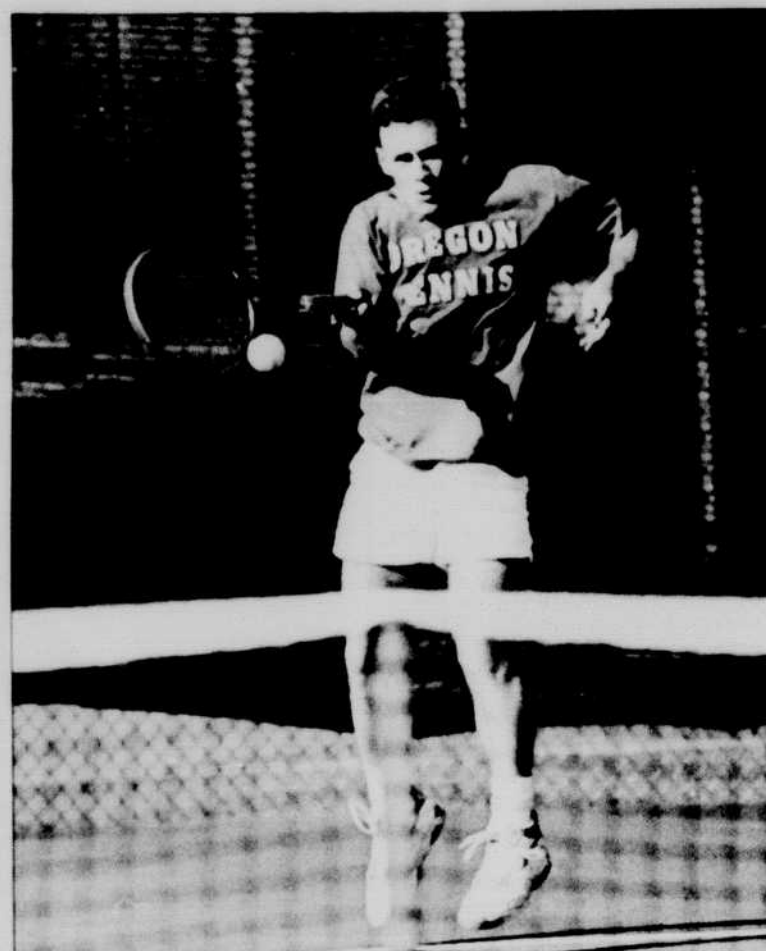

The loss drops the Ducks' season record to 9-11 and is the second to Portland this year, as the Pilots took the first meeting at home 5-1.

Oregon's next match, one that the Ducks plan to be ready for, is at home against Willamette on April 8.

Meanwhile, the Oregon women's tennis team, 14-10 on the season, spent Wednesday preparing for today's match against Puget Sound in Tacoma and the Pacific-10 Conference's Northern Division Round Robin in Seattle April 3-5.

The match against Puget Sound, a team the Ducks beat twice last year by scores of 7-2 and 6-3, will serve as a warm-up for the weekend tournament with Washington State and host Washington at the Huskies' new indoor facility.

The women's team is led by freshman Kara Yoshida at first

singles and the team of Yoshida and sophomore Sherry Fairgrieve at first doubles.

Oregon is coming off an eight-day trip to Los Angeles over spring break, in which it won four of its seven matches.

After splitting the first four matches of the week, the Ducks entered the Heritage Inn Classic and promptly disposed of Texas-El Paso and Sacramento State in the first round and semifinals, respectively, before being swept by Drake in the finals.

Coach Tom Greider hopes the experience will help his team of young players (two juniors, four sophomores and two freshmen) this weekend when they play six matches over a two-and-a-half day period.

"Hopefully we've learned something over the course of the season," Greider said. "We need to come out with the attitude that every team can beat us if we aren't ready."
